Measles outbreaks and MMR vaccine catch-up campaigns

As you are aware, there are increasing number of measles cases and local outbreaks being reported across England and a large outbreak in Wales. In 2012 there were a total of 1,920 confirmed measles cases in England, the highest annual total since enhanced follow up of measles. Measles can be very serious, with complications including brain damage and even death.

Measles activity has continued to remain high in the first three months of 2013, with a total of 587 confirmed cases reported across the country. Older children and teenagers have been particularly affected in the current outbreak as a result of the decline in MMR vaccine coverage at the turn of the century, following unfounded concerns about links between MMR vaccine and autism. The work done by Andrew Wakefield spurring these concerns has now been discredited, but vaccine coverage rates dipped.

A national campaign to get at risk children vaccinated

A national campaign has now started urging young people between 10 and 16 years of age (the age group where coverage dropped following the unfounded scares around MMR vaccine) who remain under or unvaccinated to get vaccinated. The highest priority groups are young people who are completely unvaccinated and have not received a single dose of MMR vaccine. Equally, it is very important that younger children get vaccinated.

The MMR vaccine is the only way to prevent measles

We need to aim for 95% uptake of vaccination in children under 10 who have not been vaccinated, and in the 10-16 year age group who may have missed vaccination. 95% uptake will give us "herd immunity" which means so many people in the population are vaccinated that it is difficult for the virus which causes measles to circulate. Herd immunity protects those who cannot tolerate the vaccine, such as children with leukaemia or compromised immune systems benefit too because the virus has difficulty circulating.

Currently Hertfordshire does reasonably well on the first vaccine but not so well on the second dose, as you can see from the table below.

	MMR 1 st Dose	MMR 2 nd Dose
Bedfordshire	96.3%	93.3%
Hertfordshire	94.5%	91.7%
Luton	90.7%	82.0%
Milton Keynes	94.9%	92.2%

What you can do to help now

We would very much welcome your help in ensuring teachers and school staff:

- Highlight to parents of those aged 10 - 16 the need for their children to be vaccinated or if they are unsure whether they have been vaccinated to check with their GP
- Highlight to parents of children under this age the need to check with their GP that their children have had two doses of MMR

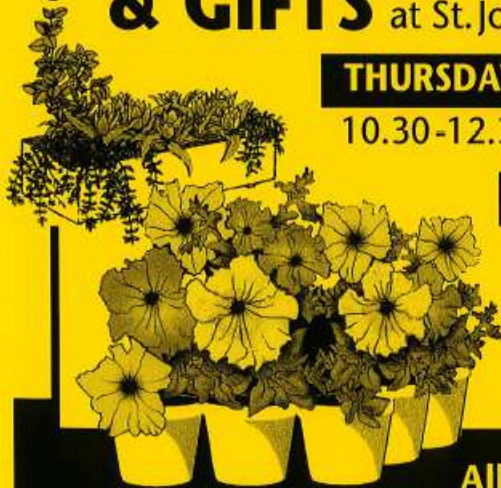
